### Guest Reporter – Ian Williams aka Rocky Rays Team Captain and Sausage King

Sunday the 30th of October was the date set for the 3rd annual Banks Phillips Cup which was a fun relay meet to commemorate a swimmer from our Rockingham Rays Masters and one from Mandurah Manna's Masters Swimming Clubs. We have a wooden swimmer trophy that is up for grabs every 12 months.

Stephen Banks hailed from Liverpool England and his enthusiasm and cheeky sense of humour resulted in him being an extremely popular member with both coaches and fellow swimmers before he sadly passed away in 2019. Stephen had many friends in the club, working with some and training with others before joining the Rocky Rays. Stephen swum as a youngster and only through a health issue much later in life did he return to the pool and rekindle his love for the swim. Although only a member for a relatively short period of time, he relished every opportunity to swim and would always be the life and soul for all the lucky swimmers who shared his lane.

We managed to get Stephen to enter in one of our annual targeted pool meets at Fremantle, although it was disappointing that the meet ran over, and the relays were dropped. This is one of the main reasons why our aim of the Banks Phillips Cup is to compete in relays between our two clubs. One of our members fondly remembered one of his catch phrases on pool deck being when introduced to new members: "My mum was gonna call me Robin, Robin Banks" Steve is still sadly missed, and this gathering continues to be a time to remember our comrade and friend.

Ken Phillips was a long serving member of Mandurah Masters, joining in the late 90s and held many committee positions including stints as President, Club Captain, Secretary and Social convenor. He developed a love of the Open Water swims as his collection of 155 swim caps earned in these swims is testimony. (Each cap was powdered and catalogued with event, his time and the conditions)



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Ken became a referee for Masters Swimming, officiating at many of the pool events, and eventually looked after the training program for others training to become referees for MSWA. He represented Australia as referee at the World Championships in Russia and as a result of this work he was named "Volunteer of the Year" at the inaugural City of Mandurah Sports Awards. Following his death this award was renamed the "Ken Phillips Volunteer Award"

Ken had a great sense of humour and loved good fun times that he would often manufacture, always associated with excellent red wines. His death through prostate cancer was felt hard within the club

So, the scene was set for a gathering of both teams and although the weather was "inclement" at best, the fun and variety of the relays meant that the competition was fierce! The cheering and team spirt by all made this another fantastic reason why we all love swimming together whether in a pool or an open water setting! The result hardly worth a mention as one point between the two teams almost makes it a draw!

To the almost 30 odd Rays and family and friends that made the long journey to the MARC (lol) thanks for coming and many thanks to all of friends at the Mandurah Manna's Masters Swimming Club.

As a side note, for some of us (maybe just me) swimming is just the prelude to the cake. In the urban dictionary, cake is another word for ass or butt. Mmmm, didn't know that. Personally, I prefer the google definition of cake being: an item of soft sweet food made from a mixture of flour, fat, eggs, sugar and other ingredients, baked and sometimes iced or decorated. 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### For the sweet toothed swimmers

#### **GINGERBREAD LOAF**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 150g butter
- 100ml golden syrup
- 2 cups plain flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 Tbsp ground ginger
- ½ tsp salt
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 cup milk
- 1 Tbsp brown sugar extra for topping

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 170°C fan bake and line a loaf tin with baking paper.
- 2. Melt together butter and golden syrup in the microwave and stir to combine.
- 3. In a large bowl sift or whisk together the dry ingredients, flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, ginger, salt and brown sugar.
- 4. Make a well in the centre and pour in the butter and golden syrup, crack in the egg and add the milk.
- 5. Stir everything together until well combined and pour into the loaf tin.
- 6. Crumble over 1 tablespoon of brown sugar.
- 7. Bake for 1 hour or until a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean

### **Rocky Ray Swimming Fact**

Freddie Lane was Australia's first Olympic swimming champion. He won 2 gold medals at the Paris Games in 1900. One of his medals was for a 200m obstacle race in which competitors climbed over a pole, scrambled over a row of boats and then swam under another row of boats! The other medal was for the 200m freestyle, much more sensible!
